## Sexting: Useful links, Information and Guidance for Children, Young People, Parents and Carers

Sexting is when someone sends or receives a sexually explicit text, image or video on their mobile phone or via a social network

When people talk about sexting, they usually mean sending and receiving:

- naked pictures or 'nudes'
- underwear shots
- sexual or 'dirty pics'
- rude text messages or videos.

They can be sent from a friend, boyfriend, girlfriend or someone you've met online. You might have also sent a sexual photo, video or text to someone else.
